PRECONFERENCE A: Brothers and Sisters of Children with Serious Illnesses: Unique Concerns, Unique Opportunities - Don Meyer, EdD *PRECONFERENCE A is designed to be a full day learning session, however participants can register for either the morning or afternoon session individually.

PART 1* Siblings are often the silent sufferers in families with seriously ill children or those with special health care needs. The Sibling Support Project is a national effort dedicated to the life-long concerns of brothers and sisters of people who have special health, developmental, or mental health concerns. Project director, Don Meyer, created the Sibshop® model and trains Sibshop facilitators throughout the world. This session, led by Meyer, will provide an extensive look at the challenges these brothers and sisters face. This full day seminar also includes an adult sibling panel, as well as interactive activities sure to spark new ideas.

PRECONFERENCE B: Cultivating Moral Resilience in Response to Moral Adversity - Cynda Hylton Rushton PhD, RN, FAAN. *Dr. Rushton, Professor of Nursing and Pediatrics at Johns Hopkins University is a recognized leader in clinical ethics, whose work in moral distress and resilience has led to recognition as a Hastings Center Fellow. PRECONFERENCE A Part 2* A Panel of Siblings of People with Serious Illnesses and Special Healthcare Needs. This panel discussion, facilitated by Don Meyer, will provide insights and an intimate view into the lives of people who have siblings with special health care needs.

PRECONFERENCE A Part 3* Models of Support for Siblings throughout the Lifespan - Don Meyer will introduce the Sibshop program model and discuss a variety of techniques and activities that engage siblings in playful experiences designed to provide encouragement and support for those living with a seriously ill or special needs child, as well as supportive opportunities for these "unsung heroes" throughout the lifespan.

PRECONFERENCE D: Navigating the Minefield: Developing Skills to Manage Conflict in Challenging Clinical Situations - Autumn Fiester PhD Conflict, both big and small, can arise in even the most cohesive of teams and families when caring for children with complex medical conditions. Participants will gain practical skills in conflict resolution in this lively, interactive session.

PRECONFERENCE E: Life, Death and Birth: A Collaborative Journey

MD FAAP. Somatic survival to prolong fetal gestational age and promote fetal
well-being when the mother has a Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) is a rare
occurrence, and one few clinicians have experienced. The objectives of this
session are to provide participants with: The knowledge to be able to care for
the mother with a TBI while prolonging gestation to ensure the best fetal
outcome and basic ethics principles to resolve the dilemma of beneficence for
the baby and non-maleficence for the mother.

Walk through this case with a meandering path that seems to have brought a measure of good to many people in need. However, at what cost? In collaboration with the interdisciplinary team from Children's Memorial Hermann, Dr. Brain Carter will facilitate this complex and thought provoking case. Dr. Carter will direct some of the ethical discourse around the words we use/speak/think in such matters and an analysis using varied approaches.
